Dear Parents and Carers

As we enter our fifth week of school closure, I wanted to write to stay in touch and to update you on what we are doing currently both in and outside of school.

It is also testament to the support and guidance you have given them that they have been able to do so. Thank you to you all for working with us as we continue to face the challenges of lock down together.

Some are on rota in school, supervising and supporting the children of key workers, alongside adapting, posting and acknowledging work on Google Classrooms, making pastoral calls, supporting with safeguarding issues, completing training, responding to emails and planning both for September, for the transition of our pupils to their new year groups – in particular Year 8 and our new Year 5 – and for our return to school should this be next half term.

As I'm sure you can fully appreciate, there are many unanswered questions at the moment and a whole range of different scenarios to think about, and so we have been having many discussions and devising plans. Our focus, as always, will be to ensure that, whatever the situation, we provide a smooth return to school for our pupils, taking into consideration their academic and pastoral
