Uniform Expectations @AMS

The majority of our children arrive at school smartly dressed and ready to learn each day and real progress has been made in this area since September. Following a review of our uniform alongside our Academy Committee, we ask all parents to ensure that the following expectations for school uniform are consistently met by all pupils. To support families as you plan for September 2023 our school website uniform section will be reviewed this term to ensure that all guidance is accurate.

- Black school shoes must be worn. No trainers, slip on or high heeled shoes are permitted. IMPORTANT: From September 2023 children will not be permitted to wear branded black trainers at Allenbourn Middle School.
- From September 2023 skirts MUST be pleated and should be no more than two or three centimetres above the knee. Trousers should not be tight fitting.
- Children can wear black tailored school shorts or trousers.
- Black or grey ankle/knee length socks or black or grey tights should be worn. Traditional school tights only are permitted.
- White socks, trainer socks, sports leggings and sheer tights are not permitted.
- Children should **not wear a hoodie including their school P.E. hoodie to school** or around our school site. Instead they should wear a school sweatshirt and/or a coat.
- Children are **not permitted to wear make-up or have any piercings** other than a single ear stud in each ear.
- Children should **not wear smart watches or similar devices** to school.
- Children should **not attend school with their hair coloured** or with any other extreme style.

Drinks in school Children are only allowed to drink water during the school day unless a drink has been purchased from the school kitchen.

Snack and Uniform Bank @AMS

Our Simple Guide

1. Each Year Group will have a SnackBank Box with pupils who are responsible for it each day.

It is our aim that all pupils will take responsibility for their year group SnackBank at least once a year.

2. As children arrive at school each day they can donate a snack to their SnackBank.

3. Each year group will **open its SnackBank for the first 10 minutes of break time** each day. **ANY child can collect a snack if they do not have one on that day**. *All we ask in return is that children note their name and class on the daily list to help us to track the impact of this initiative.*

4. If a year group SnackBank is empty, children can visit a different year group SnackBank.

Our Golden Rules supporting our key values of All Inclusive and Responsible Individuals

- Children only take one snack each day.
- Children only take a snack if they have not come to school with one or used the school kitchen at breaktime on that day
- All children treat each other with care and dignity when using or running the SnackBank

What snacks can I donate? A biscuit or cereal bar, a piece of fruit or an alternative healthy option. Please do not donate bags of crisps



Details of our UniformBank will be shared once SnackBank is up and running.

In the News - A round up of events from across the Spring Term

Year 8 STEAM challenge

In March, four Year 8 pupils took part in a **STEAM competition held at Bournemouth University**. The evening was held in the University's newest facility, the Fusion building.

The challenge was to design and build something that would benefit a poor country. The project was started in October and the group of pupils had been working on it every week up until the end of February. The project ideas had to be submitted and sent to a panel of judges before the heats took place.





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Our group who called themselves 'The Four Atoms' designed a filtration system that would repurpose already used water into safe water for agriculture.

On the evening they showed confidence when being quizzed by three different judges in a Dragon's Den style pitch. They were delighted to make it through to the final.

Our team including Chloe E, Janey H, Rosie M and Alice P all from 8D came third overall in the competition.

Well done to the girls and thank you to the parents who supported both evenings.

Science week

We **took part in science week from 13th-17th March**. This year's theme was 'Connections'.

Our first activity was linked to connections with our food, finding out where some of our food comes from. Pupils came along to start growing their own food by planting vegetable seeds. We planted tomatoes, peas, rocket, beetroot and even aubergine.

We also **built 3D constellations**. The students chose a constellation to build from straws and plasticine. Some even had a go at constellation dot to dot, to see if they could identify the constellation hidden in the image.

Eco team Spring update

We have been really **impressed with the number of members of our ecoteam** this year. We have changed to after school activities since September. So far we have **completed surveys about litter** to identify the main sources of litter and the main types of litter. We would **like to encourage pupils to bring in snacks for break time that are not wrapped in plastic** or carried in a small plastic reusable pot. We think that this will make a small reduction in the litter found outside.

We were lucky enough to have **SUSTRANS visit us** recently to set up

an **exciting new project on air pollution**. We will be looking to study different areas around the school site to identify the types of particulates around school and also to measure the amount of certain air pollutants. We will carry out a lichen study to identify where the air is clean and where improvements could be made.

We have been recording our modes of transport since the 20th March as part of the BIg Walk and Wheel event, which is run by SUSTRANS. It is designed to promote sustainable and active ways of travelling to and from school. We will be uploading the results from our survey to see how we have done compared to other schools in the country.

We have **taken part in a local litter pick**, with a main focus along East Borough and some areas within the school grounds. We were **supported by Sarah Wise from the local Wimborne War on Waste group**, who was able to provide us with the litter pickers and bags to complete our pick. **We completed this as part of the Great British Spring Clean 2023**, which is run by Keep Britain Tidy. We managed to pick 2 large bags of litter, which was excellent.

Spring Term Sports Report

Despite the field being turned into a lake as we started this term our children have still enjoyed a full range of sporting and extra curricular opportunities. Here are a few highlights for the term.





Year 7 and 8 Rugby - Both our Year 7 and 8 boys have been involved in friendly fixtures against other schools and **competed in the Bournemouth and Poole 7's competition**. It has been a successful season and we **thank Mr Moncaster** for all the time he has put into coaching the teams and running the club. *Picture of ourYear 8 Rugby team*

Year 5 Tag Rugby festival - 2 teams of 8 boys and girls attend an afternoon of competitive matches and coaching at Ferndown middle school. They had a great time and although the results were not counted, our teams certainly seemed to have a very

successful time.

Football - Year 7 and 8 have played several friendly matches, including B team matches. Year 8 were also involved in cup matches, winning their first round and then narrowly missing going through to the semi-finals on penalties.



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Year 5 have continued to have good numbers attending club (between 40-50), with an enthusiastic attitude towards playing. There have been several opportunities to take part in friendly tournaments. These were mixed matches with the aim of giving pupils the opportunity to represent the school and play together in a competitive situation. Two teams were taken to each of these tournaments.

Our Year 6 girls were involved in three six-a-side tournaments in which they played with great enthusiasm and determination.



The Year 6 boys have probably been our most successful team this year, winning the East Dorset 6-a-side tournament at Ferndown. This meant they played in the Dorset finals which was held at Wimborne Town FC. The boys fought hard to win and ended up as the county 6-a-side champions! Congratulations! They also played in a Bournemouth 'all stars' tournament where they again progressed to the finals, but this time were narrowly beaten in the final. They also took part in the 9-a-side County Cup, winning their first round match and losing the second.

They have certainly achieved a lot and we are very proud of them. Well done to all those who played and were part of the winning 6-a-side team.

We also **held our Inter-house football event for the whole school in the last week of term**, with all pupils taking part. Our overall winners were Allen House with Stour and Avon houses tied for second place and Frome finishing third.

Gymnastics It was fabulous to take some of our Year 5 and 6 pupils to the PEDSSA East Dorset team tumbling gymnastics competition.

We entered 3 teams and it was very exciting that all 3 progressed through to the finals with 1 team achieving 3rd place in a highly competitive competition.

Many congratulations to the 13 pupils we took and the 2 Yr 8 sports leaders who have helped coach the teams. They were a pleasure to take and a credit to themselves and the school. Well done!







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Cross Country - Our dedicated cross-country runners **took part in the final PEDSSA event which was run for the first time at Moors Valley Country Park**. Unfortunately it absolutely poured with rain. However, **our 40 intrepid runners** all battled on and seemed to enjoy the new course, despite the weather conditions. In the **overall rankings for the PEDSSA league** Allenbourn achieved the following brilliant results:

Yr 5 & 6 boys and girls teams both came 3rd overall.

Yr 8 girls team were 2nd overall in the Yr 8 & 9 competition

And our Yr 7 girls team were the overall winners!

Many congratulations to **Nicole in Year 8, who was our highest individually placed runner**, **achieving 4th place** in the Yr8 & 9 competition.

In January, **our strongest 16 runners ran in the County Championships**, which took place at Kings Park in Bournemouth. The minor **girls team finished a brilliant 3rd overall**, with really committed runs from Florence, Isabelle, Poppy and Tabitha. Well done, girls!

From the County event, two pupils, Jacob and Florence (both in Year 7) were named in the Dorset team for the Southwest Championships. Jacob was a reserve, but Florence made the team and went on to compete and was part of the winning Dorset team.



Netball - The Year 5 players have learnt how to play 5-a-side Bee Netball and enjoyed friendly fixtures against local schools. Year 6, 7 and 8 have all taken part in the PEDSSA leagues and tournaments, which has hugely improved their standard of play as the leagues have progressed. In the Year 7 & 8 leagues, AMS entered 2 teams which meant that all those who regularly attended club had the opportunity to play in the matches.





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Table Cricket Competition - 6 pupils from various year groups took part in a table cricket competition. They had been training for this event for several weeks, receiving coaching from the Dorset Cricket Board. All of the children returned with medals for their superb performances on the day.

Sportshall Athletics - The Year 6 sportshall athletics team travelled to Ferndown Upper School for the area PEDSSA event against six other competing middle schools. After an exciting afternoon of running, jumping and throwing **the team were placed first with a total score of 184 points**. The team will now **begin training for the county finals in April**.
