Uniform: A BIG thank you and reminders of expectations @AMS

A very big thank you to all of our families for the fantastic improvement in how our children arrive at school each day in their school uniform. This really has had a positive impact across our school. Please can I remind all parents to ensure that the following expectations for school uniform are consistently met by all pupils throughout this year.

- Black school shoes must be worn. No trainers, slip on or high heeled shoes are permitted. children are not permitted to wear branded black trainers at Allenbourn Middle School.
- Skirts MUST be pleated and should be no more than two or three centimetres above the knee. Trousers should not be tight fitting.
- Children can wear black tailored school shorts or trousers.
- Black or grey ankle/knee length socks or black or grey tights should be worn. Traditional school tights only are permitted.
- White socks, trainer socks, sports leggings and sheer tights are not permitted.
- Children should **not wear a hoodie including their school P.E. hoodie to school** or around our school site. Instead they should wear a school sweatshirt and/or a coat.
- Children are **not permitted to wear make-up or have any piercings** other than a single ear stud in each ear.
- Children should not wear smart watches or similar devices to school.
- Children should **not attend school with their hair coloured** or with any other extreme style.

Our uniform has been chosen with consideration of cost and accessibility for our families and we will continue to review this. Parents who are in receipt of free school meals may apply for a school clothing allowance. Parents wishing to claim this grant should contact the school office.

Please ensure that all of your child's school belongings are named.

Arriving at School Each Day

- Children are permitted to enter school via either of our two gates regardless of the year group that they are in.
- Please can we remind you that **children should not arrive at school before 8:30am when our school opens**. Staff are on duty each day from this time. All children should go to the playground if they arrive at school before this time.
- When bringing children to school, please ensure that your child comes straight into school.
- Children walking to school should avoid crossing the Allendale Car Park where possible.



Communication with Home

A highlight of the last academic year was continuing to develop strong links with our families as we worked hard to ensure that you receive regular and timely information about school life.

Class Charts

In order to maintain regular communication with you about your child's progress, **we use Class Charts**. This is an online system used by teachers and support staff to track attendance, achievement and behaviour throughout the school day.

One of the key benefits of using Class Charts is that we are able to securely share your child(s) accomplishments with you and to keep you up to date in real-time.

Each child has a **unique Class Charts access code**. These, **alongside activation instructions, are being produced for all of our children** and will be handed to pupils in letter form to **share with you next week**.

The Essential AMS Pupil Equipment List

Please ensure that your child attends school with the correct equipment each day. Sometimes children miss out on valuable learning opportunities at the start of lessons as they arrive without the necessary resources for learning. We will always endeavour to support pupils who occasionally arrive without a piece of equipment for learning. As pupils progress through their Middle School years, the ability to organise themselves effectively for learning is an essential skill.

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Breakfast Club

Breakfast club runs from 7.45-8.40am, Monday - Friday in the school kitchen which is situated outside the main entrance to the school. Bookings can be made directly on your ParentMail account by logging in and navigating to accounts - breakfast club.

Bookings must be made at least 3 days in advance and sessions must be paid for at the point of booking. However, if you require a last minute booking, please call the school office and we will do our best to accommodate your request.

Maintaining Good Attendance at School

We are all very aware of the **importance of attending school regularly** and **arriving on time for school each day**. We believe that **this has never been more important** as we seek to establish **high expectations and good habits to ensure future success** for our children. Your support with this throughout the academic year will benefit your child. **Did you know?**

1 school year = **195 days**.

50% attendance would mean that your child had a staggering 97.5 days of absence in a school year.

Research suggests that **on average for every 32.5 days of school missed**, children will **drop a grade in each of their GCSEs**

Our attendance procedures and expectations

Our office staff will call home if a child is marked as absent in the register without a reason. This system is in place to ensure our pupils' safety and to give you peace of mind that they have arrived safely at school each day. It is obviously of paramount importance that we can account for the whereabouts of all pupils each day. Illness can be reported on the absence telephone line or on ParentMail. Please do not email the school office for illness absences. Our answer phone is checked before calls are made each morning. Can I also remind you of the need to write a note in advance of any appointments that your child may have that require them to leave school during the teaching day. Please contact the school on each day of your child's absence.

It is vital that pupils attend school regularly throughout the school year. Good attendance at school is proven to impact significantly upon a pupil's progress. We will check our attendance figures regularly and write home to parents whose children are falling below an acceptable level P.lease do not hesitate to contact your child's Class Tutor or Year Leader if you are concerned about your child's attendance record. We are keen to recognise those individual pupils who maintain excellent attendance. **Our initial attendance information letter, with further details, will be sent to all families over the coming week**.



Pupil Safety

We regularly talk with the children about the importance of travelling to and from school safely. Please discuss the following with your children regularly to ensure their safety.

- Behaviour should be of a high standard at all times.
- Pupils should not use mobile phones whilst walking to school, particularly when crossing roads.
- Pupils must remain on pavements at all times and walk with care and consideration for others.
- Pupils using scooters or bikes should take care around other road users and those on pavements.
- Helmets should be worn on bicycles and scooters.
