Headteacher Update

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you have enjoyed the Easter break with your families. We have really enjoyed welcoming the children back to school this week.

Our Summer term calendar is incredibly busy and we are very excited about the term ahead. In this newsletter you will find initial details for a number of events taking place this term including details about our **sports day, Year 8 leavers event and end of term production**. You will also be able to catch up on some of our successes from the Spring term such as our **winning Dance Live team** and **County Football Champions**. Please can I also ask that you **take the time to read the other important reminders and updates**, taking time to share this newsletter as a family.

School Improvement Updates

I am delighted to share the news that we have **now opened all of our new toilet facilities throughout the school** with the Year 5 toilet refurbishment now being completed. We have also **installed our long awaited water refill stations** ahead of the Summer term.

Our Wall Art project is well underway as we look to install a timeline and World map on our main corridors to support our work in History and Geography lessons. Mac mini's were installed in our Music room during the Easter break to significantly improve our Music curriculum. We are **very** grateful to the school association for their valuable support that has enabled these projects to be completed. The school association has also provided the funding to have free vend dispensers fitted in our new toilets following pupil feedback to ensure that sanitary products are available discreetly and free of charge.

Staffing Update

I am pleased to be able to share the news that **later this term we will be welcoming Mrs James back to school** following maternity leave. We will also be saying **farewell to Mrs Wheeler at the end of term** as she leaves her post as SEND Lead to take on exciting new challenges. Recruitment for this important role is already well underway and I will look forward to sharing an update on this in future newsletters.

School Uniform

Please can I remind parents that **children are not permitted to wear branded trainers to school**. This **change was made for September 2023**. Whilst the vast majority of our families support this expectation we do have some children that are not wearing the correct footwear to school each day.

Changes to the school day

From **September** we will be making a small change to the timings of our school day to finish each day at 3:10pm. This is to ensure that we meet Department for Education requirements for our school to be open for an extra 25 minutes each week. Whilst we already fully meet the requirements for delivering the National Curriculum, our school day needs to be extended by 5 minutes each day. The children will have an additional 5 minutes of lunch break to support this change.

Rights Respecting Schools Award

I am delighted to report that we have secured our Bronze - Rights Committed Award and will complete our assessment to achieve the Silver award later

this term. This award supports our school vision and values and much of the children's learning in school.

The Fiver Challenge is a national programme devised by Young Enterprise, which provides children with a highly interactive and fun way of developing core enterprise and financial education skills, including problem solving, confidence, creativity and teamwork. **Since September, a group of 20 Year 6 pupils** have been working extremely hard to come up with a business idea, create a name and logo, complete market research, develop a business plan and design their product. **In the week before half term, they put their enterprise skills to the ultimate test in selling their products to Year 5 and 6 pupils**. The lunchtime sale was a resounding success with some stalls selling out entirely!









East Dorset Tumbling

Pupil Safety and conduct in our community

We regularly talk with the children about the importance of travelling to and from school safely. Please discuss the following with your children regularly to ensure their safety.

SPARX Maths - UPDATE - Our Years 7 and 8 children continue to make excellent use of Sparx Maths. All children in Year 7 and 8 complete their weekly mathematics homework on Sparx.

In the week before Easter we were **ranked 34th in the county**, **against over 2,300 schools**, with a **completion rate of 91%**.



Our 6 week rolling completion figure for Sparx is currently 88% ranking our school as 127th nationally.


