Sports Report - Autumn Term

It was another fantastic term for sports club participation and attendance. Well done to all those who continue to show commitment to them.

Football

Our Year 7 and 8 boys had some mixed results across the National, County and PEDSSA cups. Both age groups have found that as they move up the age groups the speed of the game changes. Highlights included travelling all the way to Bath for a National Cup fixture, which really tested Mr Ledsham's minibus driving ability and out-scoring the boys' teams so far across all their matches (special mention to Sienna M, 8M who is Allenbourn's current top goal scorer)! Children have some PEDSSA league matches to play this half-term, so keep a look-out to see if they can continue their scoring streak!

Our Year 5/6 girls team narrowly missed out on qualifying for the county 7-a-side competition, coming third in our district round, but are still in the County Cup. The boys are raring to go when their PEDSSA competitions happen this term. Keep an eye out on social media for the results. It was so good to see our KS2 pupils be so committed to their after-school sessions last term and I hope we will see the same levels this Spring.

Rugby Our Year 7 and 8 boys and girls teams have taken part in 10-a-side festivals at Bryanston School and Swanage and Wareham RFC. All four teams performed well and are becoming one of the

On Tuesday 22nd October we took some of our Year 8 Sports Leaders to Bryanston School for a Leadership Academy. They learned what it takes to be a good leader and how important their role is to developing physical education and sport for our younger children.

We rounded off the term with our inter house competition. This year, pupils were given the choice to represent their house in football, netball, table-tennis and dodgeball. Staff were amazed at the sportsmanship, positive attitude and teamwork on display. Results will be announced in assembly.

PEDSSA Cross Country.

It was typical cross country weather for the 32 pupils taking part at the last of the 4 PEDSSA league events. After all the races had taken place we had a nervous wait to see how we had fared. With a great run from Eliza coming in a league best of 5th place and Abi, Ada and Lottie completing the A team for Yr 5 & 6 girls we managed to secure a superb 3rd place overall. This was closely followed by the Yr 7 and 8 boys results which all came down to this last race. Our runners had an outstanding afternoon with 7 of them coming in the top 20, and Tyg and Harry in the top 10. This meant the A and B teams' scores gave them an amazing first and second position for this race! Our fingers were crossed as we waited for the overall results to be announced and it was with much celebration when we were declared as the gold medalists!

A huge well done to the 45 runners who took part in 1 or more of the cross-country events this term, particularly to those who ran in all 4 races. You have represented Allenbourn superbly and we are very proud of you.

music to match, it definitely felt like Christmas had arrived at Allenbourn!

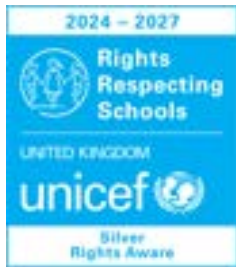

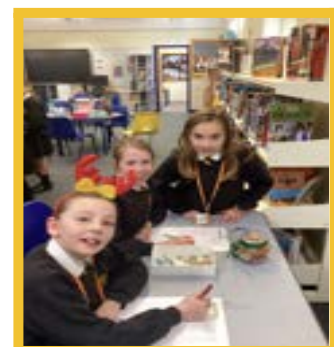
